



ROBERT M. WORSLEY, 56, was Founder, Chief Executive Officer and President of SkyMall since he founded the Company in 1989. At SkyMall, Mr. Worsley saw an opportunity to synergistically bring together airlines, catalogers and airline passengers with their "downtime". SkyMall has been the largest in-flight catalog company in the United States for over 22 years. With catalogs in aircraft seatbacks, SkyMall offers in-flight shopping services to more than 95 percent of all domestic airline passengers each year through exclusive agreements with most US airlines. Over 50% of the business is now conducted on-line via www.skymall.com. In July 2001 Mr. Worsley sold SkyMall to Mr. Murdock's NewsCorp group and agreed to stay and transition SkyMall until November 2003. In 2012 a group lead by Najafi Group in Phoenix after an introduction by Mr. Worsley purchased SkyMall. Mr. Worsley will be serving on its board. In 1999 Mr. Worsley was named Arizona's Retail Entrepreneur of the year by Ernst and Young.

Prior to founding SkyMall, from 1985 to 1989, Mr. Worsley founded ExecuShare, Inc., which provided time-shared CFO's for smaller companies. From 1980 to 1985, Mr. Worsley was a CPA with Price Waterhouse, where he last held the position of Audit Manager. Mr. Worsley received a bachelor's degree in accounting from Brigham Young University in 1980. Both Mr. and Mrs. Worsley were raised in Boise, Idaho.

Mr. Worsley retired from SkyMall in November 2003 to pursue the acquisition and development of the New Mexico and Arizona Land Company, LLC's rural assets which consisted of 100,000 acres of fee land and 1,000,000 acres of minerals. The Company was renamed NZ Legacy, LLC and is now focused on land, mineral and energy development with its assets in Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado. Plans are underway to develop uranium, travertine, potash, salt, water, oil and gas, helium, coal and other assets that have not been fully developed in the past. In 2004, Mr. Worsley entered the Arizona renewable energy field by founding and building a greenfield 27 megawatt biomass plant in Snowflake, Arizona. His motivation came from a desire to clean up Arizona's forest lands after losing property in the June 2002 Rodeo Chediski Fire, the largest forest fire in the history of the Southwest. In July 2010 Mr. Worsley and Hunt Consolidated in Dallas, Texas formed a new JV to pursue the Potash potentials of the land and mineral estate in Navajo and Apache County, Arizona. They also intend to use the same land and mineral estate to pursue renewable energy generation and transmission, energy storage and CO2 sequestration projects.

Mr. Worsley served for several years on the Board of Directors for the United Families International; a humanitarian interest involved in the preservation of the family unit and family values and served during this same period on the executive board of the Institute

for American Values in NYC. Mr. Worsley has been a supporter and involved in the BYU Center for Religious Freedom at the J. Ruben Clark Law Library.

Mr. Worsley, although never interested nor involved in politics previously, was drafted to run for the Mesa LD25 seat in the State Senate and defeated the previous Arizona Senate President Russell Pearce by more than 12%. Mr. Pearce was famous for his anti-immigration SB1070 and other ultraconservative views. Mr. and Mrs. Worsley are Founding Members of Mitt Romney's 2012 Presidential Campaign and have enjoyed meeting and assisting Gov. Romney and VP Nominee Paul Ryan on several occasions. Mr. Worsley has been invited and currently serves on numerous boards and committees including the Mesa United Way, East Valley Partnership and other community organizations. He has been active in Boy Scouts of America at various levels over his entire life since becoming an Eagle and Order of the Arrow recipient at age 14.

Mr. Worsley served a two year fulltime LDS mission in Paraguay and Uruguay in the mid 1970's and has served for over 7 years in LDS hispanic congregations as President and other supervising roles. He is fluent in Spanish and enjoys trying to speak Portuguese. He has also served in many leadership capacities in the LDS Church.

Mr. and Mrs. Worsley have traveled extensively for business and pleasure to China, Japan, Tiawan, Europe and Mexico. Mr. and Mrs. Worsley have been married 35 years, have 6 children, 17 grandchildren and together enjoy their family's seat at Legacy Ranch in the pines of Northeastern Arizona.
